Precinct vision	The Footscray Learning Precinct (FLP) will champion excellence in learning and teaching and opportunities for all students in Melbourne's inner west. The precinct will build on the richness and diversity of the community and will provide opportunities for learning in all stages of learning.				
Precinct values	Creativity, Collaboration, Excellence, Responsibility and Diversity				
Context challenges	The Precinct partners include two primary schools, a reconfigured Footscray High School,				
	Victoria University and the Maribyrnong City Council. In time there will be a new integrated Early				
	Learning Centre, and potentially one of the new Victorian Technical Schools.  To this stage, the planning and delivery of the evolving Precinct has been overseen by a Vision and Leadership Committee with a number of Development Groups covering Pedagogy, Infrastructure, Governance and Communications.				
	<ul> <li>The 10-year growth projections from 2016 for</li> <li>School-age children is a 33% increase or almost four thousand additional students.</li> <li>Pre-school age children is a 34% increase or just over two thousand children</li> <li>20 to 24-year-olds is 36% increase or just under 3000 young adults.</li> <li>Further developments within the precinct area include the construction of a new hospital, significant road and rail projects, the development of an arts precinct and a Vietnamese cultural museum providing opportunities for community-based learning. The FLP is conscious that much more remains to be done to pay better respect to indigenous history and culture.</li> </ul>				
Intent, rationale and focus	It is important to recognise in all this, that FLP key partners already play significant roles within our community, and that the overlay of a Precinct is not intended to take away from that work, rather add value, complement and support the individual strategic plans of each member organisation.  It should, therefore, be particularly focused on identifying and working towards, and evaluating a small number of well-considered value adds. These are described as the key aspirations for a "growth dividend" in the Precinct, over and above what would be normally expected from the independent work of each of the Partners.
